ABPA

Obligatory criteria

- Predisposing condition such as asthma or cystic fibrosis
- Aspergillus-specific IgE or immediate skin sensitivity to Aspergillus and elevated total IgE level >1,000

Minor criteria (two of three are required)

- Central bronchiectasis
- Peripheral blood eosinophilia
- Precipitating or IgG antibodies to Aspergillus fumigatus

Treatment of acute ABPA

- Systemic corticosteroids
 - o Monitors therapy effectiveness by following the decrease in the peripheral IgE levels
- Itraconazole or voriconazole
 - o Patients who relapse with taper of steroids
 - o Relapse with exacerbations of symptoms
 - Some advocate the use of itraconazole as part of primary therapy in an effort to minimize the duration of treatment with steroids
